<b>WATERCOURSES STILL LIKELY TO BE AFFECTED</b>	<u><b>Rivers and Tributaries in:</b></u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>IFUGAO</b> – all rivers and its tributaries</li> <li>• <b>APAYAO</b> – particularly Upper Abulug</li> <li>• <b>BENGUET</b> – particularly Upper Bauang</li> <li>• <b>MOUNTAIN PROVINCE</b> – all rivers and its tributaries</li> <li>• <b>KALINGA</b> – all rivers and its tributaries</li> <li>• <b>ABRA</b> – particularly Upper Abra, Tineg and Ikmin</li> </ul>

People living near the mountains slopes and in the low-lying areas of the above-mentioned river systems and the **Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (LDRRMCs)** concerned are **still advised to be alert for possible flashfloods and landslides.**

You are hereby directed to monitor the situation and undertake precautionary measures in your area of responsibility (AOR). Likewise, the public and the DRRMCs are advised to take appropriate actions, as necessary.

In order to better inform/warn communities, you are reminded to disseminate these through local/community leaders and through your local media, including community radio stations. Conduct press briefings as often as needed. This local effort will complement and reinforce efforts at the national level. Emphasis should be on proactive actions – evacuation rather than rescue.

Let's untiringly aim for zero casualties.
