At 03:00 AM today, a Low Pressure Area (LPA) was estimated based on all available data at **300 km east southeast** of Hinatuan, Surigao Del Sur (**7.8N, 129.0E**). Northeast Monsoon affecting Northern and Central Luzon. Tail-end of a Cold Front affecting Eastern Section of Southern Luzon.
