PRESENT WEATHER:

At **3:00 PM** today, the **center of Tropical Depression "NIMFA"** was estimated based on all available data at **640 km East of Basco, Batanes (21.1°N, 128.1°E)** with maximum sustained winds of **55 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 70 m/h. It is almost stationary.** Meanwhile, the Low-Pressure Area (LPA) was estimated based on all available data at **95 km West of Iba, Zambales (15.2°N, 119.1°E)**. Southwest Monsoon affecting Central and Southern Luzon and Western Visayas.

Cruz, San Juan, and San Cristobal • Rizal - particularly Upper Marikina and Kaliwa • Batangas - particularly Lian, Banabang-Molino, Pansipit, Kapumpang, Rosario-Lobo, and Upper Bolbok (Lawaya) • Quezon – particularly Upper Umiray, Lower Bolbok (Lawaya), Malaking-Ilog, Iyam, Macalelon, Catanauan, Silongin Lagda, Pagsanjan, Yabahaan, Bigol, Guinhalinan, Vinas, Calauag, Pandanan, Sta. WATERCOURSES LIKELY TO BE AFFECTED	<p><u>Rivers and Tributaries in:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Oriental Mindoro – particularly Malaylay-Baco, Pulang Tubig, Mag-asawang Tubig, Butas, Pula, Aagsalin, Bansud, Samagui, Bongabon, Baroc, Bulalacao, and Balete. • Palawan - particularly Abongan, Lian, Barabakan, Rizal, Caramay, Langogan, Babuyan, Bacungan, Iwahig Penal, Inagauan, Aborlan, Malasgao, Apurauan, Baton-Baton, Aramayawan, Ihawig, Panitian, Pulot, Lamakan, Kinlугan, Eraan, Tiga Plan, Malabangan, Ilog, Bansang, Conduaga, Culasian, Iwahig (Brookes), Okayan, Canipan and Busuanga, Coron. • Occidental Mindoro - particularly Abra de Ilog, Cagaray, Labangan, Magbando, Lunintao, Anahawin, Monpong, Amnay, Pola, Pagbahan, Mamburao, and Ibod. • Romblon – all rivers and its tributaries. • Marinduque – particularly Tawiran – Tagum (Marinduque) and Boac.

You are hereby directed to undertake precautionary measures and monitor the situation in your AOR. Likewise, the public and Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (DRRMCs) concerned are advised to take precautions and appropriate actions.

In order to better inform/warn communities, you are reminded to disseminate these through local/community leaders and through your local media, including community radio stations. Conduct press briefings as often as needed. This local effort will complement and reinforce efforts at the national level. Emphasis should be on proactive actions – evacuation rather than rescue.

Let's untiringly aim for zero casualty.
