WATERCOURSES LIKELY TO BE AFFECTED	<p><u>Rivers and Tributaries in:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Samar – particularly Basey, Silaga, Calbiga and Jibatan • Leyte – particularly Sangputan, Palo, Salano (Quilot), Daguitan Marabang, Cadacan, Bongquirogon, Salug, Pagnabagaran, Pagsangahan and Binahaan • Southern Leyte – particularly Bisay, Himbangan, and Pandan • Eastern Samar – Oras, Dolores, Ulot, Taft, Borongan, Suribao, Llorento, Balangia and Sulat

No.06 (Final) for Region X (Northern Mindanao)

WATERCOURSES LIKELY TO BE AFFECTED	<p><u>Rivers and Tributaries in:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Misamis Occidental – particularly Clarin, Palilan and Aloran • Lanao del Norte – particularly Mandulog, Agus, Liangan and Maranding • Bukidnon – particularly Upper Tagaloan and Upper Eastern Cagayan • Misamis Oriental – particularly Odiongan, Gingoog, Balatogan, Cabulig, Lower Tagaloan, Lower/Middle Western Cagayan, Iponon and Alubijid • Camiguin – all rivers and its tributaries

No. 06 for Region XIII (Caraga)

FORECAST 12-HR RAINFALL	Light to moderate rains.
WATERCOURSES STILL LIKELY TO BE AFFECTED	<p><u>Rivers and Tributaries in:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • SURIGAO DEL SUR particularly Cantillan, Toracan, Tandag, Tago, Hubo-Oteiza, Hinatuan and Bislig. • SURIGAO DEL NORTE particularly Surigao and Magallanes. • AGUSAN DEL NORTE particularly Lake-Mainit-Tubay, Asiga, Agusan, Linugos and Cabadbaran.
