### PRESENT WEATHER:

AT **3:00 PM** TODAY, TROPICAL DEPRESSION “LUIS” WAS ESTIMATED BASED ON ALL AVAILABLE DATA AT **505 KM** NORTH NORTHWEST OF BASCO, BATANES (**24.7 °N, 120.3 °E**) WITH MAXIMUM SUSTAINED WINDS OF **45 KM/H** NEAR THE CENTER AND GUSTINESS OF UP TO **65 KM/H**. IT IS MOVING NORTH AT **10 KM/H**. MEANWHILE, THE LOW PRESSURE AREA WAS ESTIMATED AT **1,055 KM** EAST OF BASCO, BATANES (**22.0 °N, 132.0°E**). SOUTHWEST MONSOON AFFECTING THE WESTERN SECTION OF NORTHERN AND CENTRAL LUZON.
