PRESENT WEATHER:

At 3:00 PM today, the eye of Typhoon “GORIO” (NESAT) was located based on all available data at 335 km North of Basco, Batanes (23.4°N 122.6°E) with maximum sustained winds of 145 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 180 km/h. It is forecast to move Northwest at 19 km/h. Southwest Monsoon affecting the western section of Northern and Central Luzon.
