<b>WATERCOURSES STILL LIKELY TO BE AFFECTED</b>	<p><b><u>Rivers and Tributaries in:</u></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Surigao Del Norte</b>- particularly Surigao and Magallanes</li> <li>• <b>Dinagat Islands</b>- particularly Malinao Inlet and Gaas Lulet</li> <li>• <b>Agusan Del Sur</b> – particularly Ojot, Wawa, Libang, Maosam, Kasilan, Gibong, Adgaoan, Sinulao, Kayonan and Andanan</li> <li>• <b>Surigao Del Sur</b>- particularly Cantillan, Toracan, Tandag, Tago, Hubo-Oteiza, Hinatuan and Bislig</li> <li>• <b>Agusan Del Norte</b>- particularly Lake- Mainit-Tubay, Asiga, Agusan, Linugos and Cabadbaran</li> </ul>

People living near the mountain slopes and low-lying areas near the above-mentioned rivers and the local disaster risk reduction and management councils concerned are still advised to take precautionary measures.

In order to better inform/warn communities, you are reminded to disseminate these through local/community leaders and through your local media, including community radio stations. Conduct press briefings as often as needed. This local effort will complement and reinforce efforts at the national level. Emphasis should be on proactive actions – evacuation rather than rescue.

Let's untiringly aim for zero casualties.
