SOUTHWEST MONSOON AFFECTING THE WESTERN SECTION OF LUZON. MEANWHILE, AT 3:00 AM TODAY, THE EYE OF TYPHOON SOULIK WAS LOCATED BASED ON ALL AVAILABLE DATA AT 1,360 KM NORTHEAST OF EXTREME NORTHERN LUZON (27.1 °N, 133.2 °E) [OUTSIDE PAR] WITH MAXIMUM SUSTAINED WINDS OF 160 KM/H NEAR THE CENTER AND GUSTINESS OF UP TO 195 KM/H. MOVING WEST NORTHWEST 20KM/H
