Cruz, San Juan and San Cristobal.</li> <li>• RIZAL – particularly Upper Marikina and Kaliwa.</li> </ul>

<b>WATERCOURSES STILL LIKELY TO BE AFFECTED</b>	<p><b><u>Rivers and Tributaries in:</u></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Catanduanes</b> – particularly Cabuyan, Bato and Pajo</li> <li>• <b>Camarines Norte</b> – particularly Labo and Daet Basud</li> <li>• <b>Camarines Sur</b> – particularly Lower Kilbay, Catabangan, Ragay, Tinalmud, Tambang and Lagonoy</li> <li>• <b>Albay</b> – particularly Guinale and Upper Donsol</li> <li>• <b>Masbate</b> – particularly Lanang, Mapayawan, Mandaong, Asid, Malbag, Guiom, Nainday, Daraga, Nauco (Aguada) and Beleno</li> <li>• <b>Sorsogon</b> – particularly Lower Donsol, Ogod, Putiao, Cadacan, Banuang-Duan, Fabrica (Tugbugan) and Matnog</li> </ul>

**No. 02 for Region VIII (Eastern Visayas)**

<b>FORECAST 12-HR RAINFALL</b>	<b>Light to moderate with at times heavy rains.</b>
<b>WATERCOURSES STILL LIKELY TO BE AFFECTED</b>	<p><b><u>Rivers and Tributaries in:</u></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Northern Samar</b> – particularly Catarman, Bugko, Pambukhan, Catubig, Palapag, Mano and Gamay.</li> <li>• <b>Leyte</b> – particularly Sangputan, Palo, Salano (Quilot), Daguitan Marabang, Cadacan, Bongquirogon, Salug, Pagbanagaran, Pagsanghan, and Binahaan.</li> <li>• <b>Southern Leyte</b> – particularly Bisay, Himbangan and Pandan.</li> <li>• <b>Eastern Samar</b> – particularly Oras, Dolores, Ulot, Taft, Borongan, Suribao, Llorento, Balangiga and Sulat.</li> <li>• <b>Samar</b> – particularly Basey, Silaga, Calbiga and Jibatan.</li> <li>• <b>Biliran</b> – all rivers and its tributaries.</li> </ul>



**No. 02 (Final) for Region IX (Zamboanga Peninsula)**

<b>FORECAST 12-HR RAINFALL</b>	<b>Light rains and isolated thunderstorms.</b>
<b>WATERCOURSES NO LONGER TO BE AFFECTED</b>	<p><b><u>Rivers and Tributaries in:</u></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Zamboang del Sur</b> - Kamalarang, Tupilac, Labangan and Mapangi.</li> <li>• <b>Zamboanga Sibugay</b> - Tumaga, Taguite, Tigbao, Digma, Sanito, Bakalan, Kabasalan and Sibuguey.</li> <li>• <b>Zamboanga del Norte</b> particularly Paro-Dapitan, Dipolog, Dikaya, Golid Duwait, Sindangan, Ingin (Maras), Palandoc, Bucas, Pataug, Quipit, Siocon, Piacan, Anungan, Pangamiran and Sibuco.</li> </ul>
<b>With this development and unless significant rain occurs, this is the final general flood advisory for this event.</b>	

**No. 01 for Region XIII (Caraga)**

<b>FORECAST 12-HR RAINFALL</b>	<b>Light to moderate rains and thunderstorms.</b>
<b>WATERCOURSES LIKELY TO BE AFFECTED</b>	<p><b><u>Rivers and Tributaries in:</u></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Surigao del Norte</b> – particularly Surigao and Magallanes.</li> <li>• <b>Agusan del Sur</b> – particularly Ojot, Wawa, Libang, Maosam, Kasilan, Gibong, Adgaoan, Sinulao, Kayonan and Andanan.</li> <li>• <b>Dinagat Islands</b> – particularly Malinao Inlet and Gaas Lulet</li> <li>• <b>Agusan del Norte</b> – particularly Lake-Mainit-Tubay, Asiga, Agusan, Linugos, and Cabadbaran.</li> <li>• <b>Surigao del Sur</b> – particularly Cantillan, Toracan, Tandag, Tago, Hubo-Oteiza, Hinatuan, and Bislig.</li> </ul>
