WATERCOURSES STILL LIKELY TO BE AFFECTED	Rivers and Tributaries in: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• PANGASINAN - particularly Balincuguin and Alaminos.• ILOCOS SUR - particularly Lower Abra, Silay-Sta. Maria and Buaya.• LA UNION - particularly Amburayan, Bararo, Lower Bauang and Aringay.• ILOCOS NORTE - particularly Bulu, Banban, Bacarra-Vintar, Laoag and Quiaoit.

No. 03 for Region II (Cagayan Valley)

WATERCOURSES STILL LIKELY TO BE AFFECTED	Rivers and Tributaries in: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• CAGAYAN - particularly Linao, Lower Abulug, Lower Pamplona, Cabcungan, Aunugay, Baua, Palawaig and Taboan.• ISABELA - particularly Dikatayan, Dinilican and Palanan-Pinacanauan.• BATANES – all rivers and its tributaries.• QUIRINO – all rivers and its tributaries.

No. 24 for Region III (Central Luzon)

FORECAST 12-HR RAINFALL	LIGHT TO MODERATE RAINS
WATERCOURSES LIKELY TO BE AFFECTED	<u>Rivers and Tributaries in:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • BATAAN – particularly Balanga and Morong. • ZAMBALES –particularly Panatawan, Sto. Tomas, Bucau, Bancul and Lawis.

No. 12 for Region IV-B (MIMAROPA)

FORECAST 12-HR RAINFALL	LIGHT TO MODERATE RAINS
WATERCOURSES LIKELY TO BE AFFECTED	<u>Rivers and Tributaries in:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • ORIENTAL MINDORO - particularly Malaylay-Baco, Pulang Tubig, Mag-asawang Tubig, Butas, Pula, Agsalin, Bansud, Samagui, Bongabon, Baroc, Bulalacao and Balete. • OCCIDENTAL MINDORO - particularly Abra de Ilog, Cagaray, Labangan, Magbando, Lunintao, Anahawin, Monpong, Amnay, Pola, Pagbahan, Mamburao and Ibod. • PALAWAN –particularly Abongan, Lian, Barabakan, Rizal, Caramay, Langogan, Babuyan, Bacungan, Iwahig Penal, Inagauan, Aborlan, Malasgao, Apurauan, Baton-Baton, Aramayawan, Ihawig, Panitian, Pulot, Lamakan, Kinlugaan, Eraan, Tiga Plan, Malabangan, Ilog, Bansang, Conduaga, Culasian, Iwahig (Brookes), Okayan, Canipan and Busuanga, Coron.

No. 10 (Final) for Region VI (Western Visayas)

WATERCOURSES NO LONGER TO BE AFFECTED	<u>Rivers and Tributaries in:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • CAPIZ - particularly Panay, Mambusao, Panay Malinao, Alingon and Balantian. • ANTIQUE - particularly Sibalom, Ipayo, Cagaranan, Palawan, Cairauan, Dalanas and Tibiao. • ILOILO - particularly Pinantan, Barotac, Akalaygan, Jalaud, Jalano, Jagdong, Jalaur, Lamunan, Jaro-Agaman, Sibalom and Guimbal. • AKLAN - particularly Ibajay, Aklan and Jalo. • NEGROS OCCIDENTAL - particularly Malogo, Sicaba, Grande, Himocaan, Danao, Upper Tyabanan, Sipalay and Lower Ilog.

No. 03 for CAR (Cordillera Administrative Region)

FORECAST 12-HR RAINFALL	LIGHT TO MODERATE WITH AT TIMES HEAVY RAINS
WATERCOURSES LIKELY TO BE AFFECTED	<u>Rivers and Tributaries in:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • APAYAO – particularly Upper Abulug. • BENGUET – particularly Upper Bauang. • IFUGAO – all rivers and its tributaries. • MOUNTAIN PROVINCE – all rivers and its tributaries. • KALINGA – all rivers and its tributaries. • ABRA – particularly Upper Abra, Tineg and Ikmin.

PUBLIC WARNING:

People living near the mountain slopes and low-lying areas near the above-mentioned cities and municipalities and the **Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils** (LDRRMCs) concerned are **still advised to be alert for possible flashfloods and landslides.**

Further, local flooding is possible in urban and agricultural areas due to or drainage system and impounding water.

In order to better inform/warn communities, you are reminded to disseminate these through local/community leaders and through your local media, including community radio stations. Conduct press briefings as often as needed. This local effort will complement and reinforce efforts at the national level. Emphasis should be on proactive actions – evacuation rather than rescue.

Let's untiringly aim for zero casualty.
