WATERCOURSES LIKELY TO BE AFFECTED	<u>Rivers and Tributaries in:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• CEBU - rivers and its tributaries particularly Kotkot, Mananga, Guinabasan, Balamban and Sapang Dako.• NEGROS ORIENTAL - rivers and its tributaries particularly Libertad, Tanjay, Candugay, Siaton, Cauitan, Sipocong, Bayawan, Pagatban and Lower Tyabanan.• BOHOL - rivers and its tributaries particularly Inabanga, Ipil, Matulid, Loboc and Abatan.

No. 04 for Region VIII (Eastern Visayas)

FORECAST 12-HR RAINFALL	Moderate to occasionally heavy rains.
WATERCOURSES STILL LIKELY TO BE AFFECTED	<u>Rivers and Tributaries in:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Northern Samar – particularly Catarman, Bugko, Pambukhan, Catubig, Palapag, Mano and Gamay.• Leyte – particularly Sangputan, Palo, Salano (Quilot), Daguitan Marabang, Cadacan, Bongquirogon, Salug, Pagbanagaran, Pagsanghan, and Binahaan.• Southern Leyte – particularly Bisay, Himbangan and Pandan.• Eastern Samar – particularly Oras, Dolores, Ulot, Taft, Borongan, Suribao, Llorento, Balangiga and Sulat.• Samar – particularly Basey, Silaga, Calbiga and Jibatan.• Biliran – all rivers and its tributaries.

No. 03 for Region XIII (Caraga)

FORECAST 12-HR RAINFALL	Light to moderate rains.
WATERCOURSES LIKELY TO BE AFFECTED	<u>Rivers and Tributaries in:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Surigao del Norte – particularly Surigao and Magallanes.• Dinagat Islands – particularly Malinao Inlet and Gaas Lulet• Agusan del Norte – particularly Lake-Mainit-Tubay, Asiga, Agusan, Linugos, and Cabadbaran.• Surigao del Sur – particularly Cantillan, Toracan, Tandag, Tago, Hubo-Oteiza, Hinatuan, and Bislig.

PUBLIC WARNING:

People living near the mountain slopes and in the low lying areas of the above mentioned river systems and the Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (LDRRMCs) concerned advised to be alert for possible flashfloods.

In order to better inform/warn communities, you are reminded to disseminate this through local/community leaders and through your local media, including community radio stations. This local effort will complement and reinforce efforts at the national level. Emphasis should be on proactive actions – evacuation rather than rescue.

Let's untiringly aim for zero casualty.
