At 7:00 pm today, the eye of typhoon "ROSITA" was located based on all available data including Daet Radar at 250 km east northeast of Casiguran, Aurora (16.8 n, 124.4 e).

Maria and Buaya.• Pangasinan - particularly Balincuguin and Alaminos.• La Union - particularly Amburayan, Bararo, lower Bauang and Aringay.

WATERCOURSES LIKELY TO BE AFFECTED	Rivers and Tributaries in: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Aurora – particularly Casiguran, Aguang, and Lower Umiray. • Nueva Ecija – all rivers and tributaries • Tarlac – all rivers and its tributaries

No. 2 for CAR (Cordillera Administrative Region)

FORECAST 12-HR RAINFALL	Moderate to Heavy Rains
WATERCOURSES LIKELY TO BE AFFECTED	Rivers and Tributaries in: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Mountain Province – all rivers and its tributaries • Benguet – particularly upper Bauang • Apayao – particularly upper Abulug • Abra – particularly upper Abra, Tineg and Ikmin • Ifugao – all rivers and its tributaries • Kalinga – all rivers and its tributaries

People living near the mountains slopes and in the low-lying areas of the above-mentioned river systems and the Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (LDRRMCs) concerned are advised to take necessary precautionary measures.


You are hereby directed to monitor the situation and undertake precautionary measures in your area of responsibility (AOR). Likewise, the public and the DRRMCs are advised to take appropriate actions, as necessary.

In order to better inform/warn communities, you are reminded to disseminate these through local/community leaders and through your local media, including community radio stations. Conduct press briefings as often as needed. This local effort will complement and reinforce efforts at the national level. Emphasis should be on proactive actions – evacuation rather than rescue.

Let's untiringly aim for zero casualties.
