### PRESENT WEATHER:

Ridge of a High Pressure Area (HPA) affecting Visayas. Meanwhile, at 4:00 PM today, the center of a tropical depression outside the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) was estimated based on all available data at 415 km west of Sinait, Ilocos Sur (17.5°N, 116.5°E) with maximum sustained winds of 55km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 65 km/h. It is forecast to move north northwest at 13km/h.

Concerned Regional and Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (R/LDRRMCs) are still advised to take necessary preparedness measures and possible response actions.

In order to better inform/warn communities, you are reminded to disseminate this through local/community leaders and through your local media, including community radio stations. Conduct press briefings as often as needed. This local effort will complement and reinforce efforts at the national level. Emphasis should be on proactive actions – evacuation rather than rescue.

Let's untiringly aim for zero casualties.
