**PRESENT WEATHER:**

At 3:00 AM Today, the center of tropical depression "HENRY" was estimated based on all available data at 75 km West – Southwest of Calayan, Cagayan (19.1 N, 120.8 E) with maximum sustained winds of 60 KM/H near the center and gustiness of up to 75 KM/H. Moving West at 20 KM/H. Meanwhile, the Low Pressure Area (LPA) was estimated at 825 KM East of Infanta, Quezon (15.4 N, 129.3 E). Southwest Monsoon affecting the country.

<b>WATERCOURSES STILL LIKELY TO BE AFFECTED</b>	<p><b>Rivers and Tributaries in:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Antique</b> particularly Sibalom, Ipayo, Cagaranan, Palawan, Cairauan, Dalanas and Tibiao.</li> <li>• <b>Aklan</b> particularly Ibajay, Aklan and Jalo.</li> <li>• <b>Iloilo</b> particularly in Pinantan, Barotac, Akalaygan, Jalaud, Jalano, Jagdong, Jalaur, Lamunan, Jaro-Agaman, Sibalom and Guimbal.</li> <li>• <b>Negros Occidental</b> particularly Malogo, Sicaba, Grande, Himocaan, Danao, Upper Tyabanan, Sipalay and Lower Ilog</li> <li>• <b>Capiz</b> particularly Panay, Mambusao, Panay Malinao, Alingon and Balantian</li> </ul>

<b>WATERCOURSES STILL LIKELY TO BE AFFECTED</b>	<p><b>Rivers and Tributaries in:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Abra</b> particularly Upper Abra, Tineg, Ikmin.</li> <li>• <b>Ifugao</b> – all rivers and its tributaries.</li> <li>• <b>Apayao</b> particularly Upper Abulug.</li> <li>• <b>Mountain Province</b> – all rivers and its tributaries</li> <li>• <b>Kalinga</b> – all rivers and its tributaries</li> <li>• <b>Benguet</b> particularly Upper Bauang</li> </ul>
