### PRESENT WEATHER:

At 3:00 AM today, the eye of Typhoon "Rosita" was located based on all available data at 550 km East of Tuguegarao City, Cagayan (17.4°N, 126.9°E). with maximum sustained winds of up to 170 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 210 km/h. It is moving west southwest at 15 km/h.

You are hereby directed to monitor the situation and undertake precautionary measures in your area of responsibility (AOR). Likewise, the public and the DRRMCs are advised to take appropriate actions, as necessary.

In order to better inform/warn communities, you are reminded to disseminate these through local/community leaders and through your local media, including community radio stations. Conduct press briefings as often as needed. This local effort will complement and reinforce efforts at the national level. Emphasis should be on proactive actions – evacuation rather than rescue.

Let's untiringly aim for zero casualties.
