PRESENT WEATHER:

AT 3:00 PM TODAY, THE LOW PRESSURE AREA (LPA) WAS ESTIMATED BASED FROM ALL AVAILABLE DATA AT 140 KM SOUTH SOUTHEAST OF PUERTO PRINSESA CITY, PALAWAN (8.6N, 119.2E). EASTERLIES AFFECTING EASTERN SECTION OF THE COUNTRY. MINDANAO WILL HAVE PARTLY CLOUD TO CLOUDY SKIES WITH ISOLATED RAINSHOWERS DUE TO LOCALIZED THUNDERSTORMS.

FORECAST 12-HR RAINFALL	Isolated rainshowers or thunderstorms
WATERCOURSES	CAGAYAN DE ORO RIVER AND ITS TRIBUTARIES

BE AFFECTED	MAMALA, BATANG, AND TAGITE RIVERS.
