Tail – end of a cold front affecting the eastern section of Southern Luzon. Northeast Monsoon affecting Northern and Central Luzon.

WATERCOURSES LIKELY TO BE AFFECTED	<u>Rivers and Tributaries in:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Camarines Sur particularly Lower Kilbay, Catabangan, Ragay, Tinalmud, Tambang and Lagonoy.• Catanduanes particularly Cabuyan, Bato and Pajo.• Camarines Norte particularly Labo and Daet Basud.• Masbate particularly Lanang, Mapayawan, Mandaong, Asid, Malbag, Guiom, Nainday, Daraga, Nauco (Aguada) and Beleno.• Albay particularly Guinale and Upper Donsol.• Sorsogon particularly Lower Donsol, Ogod, Putiao, Cadacan, Banuang-Duan, Fabrica (Tugbugan) and Matnog.
