PRESENT WEATHER:

At **3:00 PM today**, the center of Severe Tropical Storm "GORIO" (NESAT) was estimated based on all available data at **605 km East of Tuguegarao City, Cagayan (17.9°N 127.4°E)** with maximum sustained winds of **90 km/h** near the center and gustiness of up to **115 km/h**. It is forecast to move Northwest at 13 km/h. Southwest Monsoon affecting Luzon and Western Visayas.
