NEGROS ORIENTAL - rivers and its tributaries particularly Libertad, Tanjay, Candugay, Siaton, Cauitan, Sipocong, Bayawan, Pagatban and Lower Tyabanan. BOHOL - rivers and its tributaries particularly Inabanga, Ipil, Matulid, Loboc and Abatan.

Leyte – particularly Sangputan, Palo, Salano (Quilot), Daguitan Marabang, Cadacan, Bongquirogon, Salug, Pagbanagaran, Pagsanghan, and Binahaan. Southern Leyte – particularly Bisay, Himbangan and Pandan. Eastern Samar – particularly Oras, Dolores, Ulot, Taft, Borongan, Suribao, Llorento, Balangiga and Sulat. Samar – particularly Basey, Silaga, Calbiga and Jibatan. Biliran – all rivers and its tributaries.

WATERCOURSES NO LONGER TO BE AFFECTED	<p><u>Rivers and Tributaries in:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Surigao del Norte – particularly Surigao and Magallanes. Dinagat Islands – particularly Malinao Inlet and Gaas Lulet Agusan del Norte – particularly Lake-Mainit-Tubay, Asiga,

	Agusan, Linugos, and Cabadbaran. • Surigao del Sur – particularly Cantillan, Toracan, Tandag, Tago, Hubo-Oteiza, Hinatuan, and Bislig.
