PRESENT WEATHER:

At 3:00 PM today, the eye of Typhoon "RAMON" {KALMAEGI} was estimated based on all available data at 100 km East of Calayan, Cagayan (19.3 degN, 122.4 degE), with maximum sustained winds of 120 kph near the eye and gustiness of up to 165 kph. It remains almost stationary. Furthermore, at 3:00 PM today, the center of Tropical Depression "SARAH" was estimated based on all available data at 630 km East Northeast of Borongan City, Eastern Samar (13.1 degN, 131.0 degE), with maximum sustained winds of 55 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 70 kph. It is moving Northwest at 35 kph.
