**PRESENT WEATHER:**

AT 3:00 AM TODAY, THE CENTER OF TROPICAL STORM "YUTU" (FORMERLY ROSITA) WAS LOCATED BASED ON ALL AVAILABLE DATA AT 402 KM WEST NORTHWEST OF LAOAG, ILOCOS NORTE (19.1N, 116.9E) WITH MAXIMUM SUSTAINED WINDS OF UP TO 90 KM/H NEAR THE CENTER AND GUSTINESS OF UP TO 115 KM/H. IT IS MOVING NORTH NORTHWEST AT 15 KM/H.

People living near the mountains slopes and in the low-lying areas of the above-mentioned river systems and the Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (LDRRMCs) concerned are still advised to take appropriate actions.

You are hereby directed to monitor the situation and undertake precautionary measures in your area of responsibility (AOR). Likewise, the public and the DRRMCs are advised to take appropriate actions, as necessary.

In order to better inform/warn communities, you are reminded to disseminate these through local/community leaders and through your local media, including community radio stations. Conduct press briefings as often as needed. This local effort will complement and reinforce efforts at the national level. Emphasis should be on proactive actions – evacuation rather than rescue.

Let's untiringly aim for zero casualties.
