PRESENT WEATHER:

At 3:00 AM today, the eye of Typhoon "OMPONG" was located based on all available data in the vicinity of Baggao, Cagayan (17.9°N, 121.9°E) maximum sustained winds of 200 KM/H near the center and gustiness of up to 330 KM/H. It is moving West Northwest at 35 KM/H. Southwest monsoon affecting Southern Luzon, Visayas and Mindanao.

WATERCOURSES LIKELY TO BE AFFECTED	<u>Rivers and Tributaries in:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • ZAMBOANGA DEL NORTE – particularly Paro-Dapitan, Dipolog, Dikaya, Golid Duwait, Sindangan, Ingin (Maras), Palandoc, Bucas, Pataug, Quipit, Siocon, Piacan, Anungan, Pangamiran and Sibuco. • ZAMBOANGA SIBUGAY – particularly Tumaga, Taguite, Tigbao, Digma, Sanito, Bakalan, Kabasalan and Sibuguey. • ZAMBOANGA DEL SUR – particularly Kamalarang, Tupilac, Labangan and Mapangi.

No. 04 for CAR (Cordillera Administrative Region)

FORECAST 12-HR RAINFALL	Moderate to heavy rains.
WATERCOURSES LIKELY TO BE AFFECTED	<u>Rivers and Tributaries in:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • APAYAO – particularly Upper Abulug. • KALINGA • MOUNTAIN PROVINCE • BENGUET – particularly Upper Bauang. • IFUGAO • ABRA – particularly Upper Abra, Tineg and Ikmin.

You are hereby directed to monitor the situation and undertake precautionary measures in your area of responsibility (AOR). Likewise, the public and the DRRMCs are advised to take appropriate actions, as necessary.

In order to better inform/warn communities, you are reminded to disseminate these through local/community leaders and through your local media, including community radio stations. Conduct press briefings as often as needed. This local effort will complement and reinforce efforts at the national level. Emphasis should be on proactive actions – evacuation rather than rescue.

Let's untiringly aim for zero casualties.
