PRESENT WEATHER:

At **3:00 AM** today, the center of Tropical Depression "USMAN" was estimated based on all available data at **100 km** East Southeast of Guiuan, Eastern Samar (**10.8 N, 126.6 E**) with maximum sustained winds of 55 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 65 km/h. **Moving west at 15 km/h.** Northeast Monsoon affecting Northern and Central Luzon.

WATERCOURSES STILL LIKELY TO BE AFFECTED	<p><u>Rivers and Tributaries in:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • EASTERN SAMAR - particularly in Oras, Dolores, Ulot, Taft, Borongan, Suribao, Llorento, Balangiga And Sulat. • NORTHERN SAMAR - particularly in Catarman, Bugko, Pambukhan, Catubig, Palapag, Maou and Gamay. • LEYTE - particularly in Sangputan, Palo, Salano (Quilot), Daguitan Marabang, Cadacan, Bongquirogon, Salug, Pagbanagaran, Pagsangahan and Binahaan. • SAMAR - particularly in Basey, Silaga, Calbiga and Jibatan. • BILIRAN - all rivers and its tributaries.

WATERCOURSES NO LONGER TO BE AFFECTED	<p><u>Rivers and Tributaries in:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • SURIGAO DEL NORTE - particularly in Surigao and Magallanes. • DINAGAT ISLANDS - particularly in Malinao Inlet and Gaas Lulet. • AGUSAN DEL NORTE - particularly in Lake-Mainit-Tubay, Asiga, Agusan, Linugos and Cabadbaran. • AGUSAN DEL SUR – particularly Ojot, Wawa, Libang, Maosam, Kasilan, Gibong, Adgaoan, Sinulao, Kayonan and Andanan. • SURIGAO DEL SUR - particularly in Cantillan, Toracan, Tandag, Tago, Hubo-Oteiza, Hinatuan and Bislig.
