#### **AVERAGE BASIN RAINFALL (MM):**

**PAST 91-HRS. ENDING AT 3:00 AM TODAY = 160.5 MM**  
**FORECAST 24-HRS. BEGINNING 3:00PM TODAY = LIGHT TO OCCASIONALLY MODERATE RAINS**

#### **BASIN EXPECTED RESPONSE:**

1. Water level of allied Sinocalan-Pantal River and Tributaries- Ingalera, Tuboy, Tagamusing rivers and streams will be above alarm
  - **Flooding is still threatening: In the low lying areas of Sta. Barbara, Calasiao, Binmaley, Binalonan, Malasiqui and Cities of Dagupan and Urdaneta.**
2. Slow rise of allied Bued-Cayanga River and Tributaries- Patalan, Angalacan, Aloragat Rivers and Streams.
  - **Flooding is still threatening: In the low lying areas of Mangaldan, Mapandan, San Fabian, San Jacinto, Laoac, Manaoag, Sison and Pozorrubio**

**The residents and the Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (DRMMCs) concerned are still advised to take appropriate actions.**

#### **PUBLIC WARNING:**

People living in the low lying areas particularly the above mentioned areas and the Local DRRM Councils concerned are advised to be alert and take appropriate actions.

#### **ACTIONS TAKEN:**

##### **NDRRMC-OPCEN**

- Disseminated **Flood Bulletin No. 06 for Agno and Allied River Basins** to **OCD Regional Center I** through SMS and facsimile and uploaded same at the NDRRMC website for further dissemination to their respective local disaster risk reduction and management councils (LDRRMCs) from the provincial down to the municipal levels
- Directed RDRRMCs concerned through the OCD Regional Center to undertake precautionary measures in their area of responsibility (AOR) and subsequently advised local DRRMCs to initiate pre-emptive evacuation of families in low-lying areas if situation warrants.
