<b>WATERCOURSES STILL LIKELY TO BE AFFECTED</b>	<b>Rivers and Tributaries in:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• <b>OCCIDENTAL MINDORO</b> - particularly Abra de Ilog, Caragay, Labangan, Magbando, Lunintao, Anahawin, Monpong, Amnay, Pola, Pagbahan, Mamburao and Ibod.</li><li>• <b>PALAWAN</b> - particularly Abongan, Lian, Barabakan, Rizal, Caramay, Langonan, Babuyan, Bacungan, Iwahig Penal, Inagauan, Aborlan, Malasgao, Apurauan, Baton – Baton, Aramayawan, Iwahig, Panitian, Pulot, Lamakan, Kinlungan, Eraan, Tiga Plan, Malabangan, Ilog, Bansang, Conduaga, Culasian, Iwahig (Brookes), Okayan, Canipan and Busuanga, Coron.</li><li>• <b>ORIENTAL MINDORO</b> - particularly Malaylay-Baco, Pulang Tubig, Mag-asawang Tubig, Butas, Pula, Aagsalin, Bansud, Samagui, Bongabon, Borac, Bulalacao and Balete.</li></ul>
