PRESENT WEATHER:

At 4:00 PM today, the Center of Tropical Depression "AURING" was estimated based on available data in the vicinity of Cagdianao, Dinagat Islands (9.9°N, 125.7°E) with maximum sustained winds of 55 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 70 kph. It is forecast to move Northwest at 9 kph. Northeast Monsoon affecting Northern and Central Luzon.
