PRESENT WEATHER:

At 4:00 AM today, the Low Pressure Area (LPA) was estimated based on all available data at 940 km East of Guiuan, Eastern Samar (11.3N, 134.3E).

No. 04 (Final) for Region IX (ZAMBOANGA PENINSULA)

FORECAST 12-HR RAINFALL	Light rains
WATERCOURSES NO LONGER TO BE AFFECTED	 Rivers and Tributaries in: ZAMBOANGA SIBUGAY particularly Tumaga, Taguite, Tigbao, Digsa, Sanito, Bakalan, Kabasalan and Sibuguey ZAMBOANGA DEL NORTE particularly Paro-Dapitan, Dipolog, Dikaya, Golid Duwait, Sindangan, Ingin (Maras), Palandoc, Bucas, Pataug, Quipit, Siocon, Piacan, Anungan, Pangamiran and Sibuco. ZAMBOANGA DEL SUR particularly Kamalarang, Tupilac, Labangan and Mapangi.

With this development and unless significant rain occurs, this is the final General Flood Advisory for Region 9 (Zamboanga Peninsula).

No. 04 for Region XII (SOCCSKSARGEN)

FORECAST 12-HR RAINFALL	Light to occasionally moderate rains
WATERCOURSES STILL LIKELY TO BE AFFECTED	 Rivers and Tributaries in: SULTAN KUDARAT particularly Tian and Kraan. SARANGANI particularly Kalaong, Buayan-Malungan, Little-Lun, Big-Lun, and Gian. SOUTH COTABATO particularly Siquil, Makar, and Banaga

PUBLIC WARNINGS:

People living near the mountain slopes and in the low lying areas of the above mentioned river systems and the local disaster risk reduction and management councils (LDRRMCs) concerned are still advised to be on alert for possible/further flashfloods and landslides and to take necessary precautionary measures.

In order to better inform/warn communities, you are reminded to disseminate this through local/community leaders and through your local media, including community radio stations. Conduct press briefings as often as needed. This local effort will complement and reinforce efforts at the national level. Emphasis should be on proactive actions – evacuation rather than rescue.

Let's untiringly aim for zero casualties.
