PRESENT WEATHER:

At 4:00 PM today, the center of Tropical Depression "Crising" was estimated based on all available data at 555 km East of Maasin, Southern Leyte (10.4°N, 129.9°E) with maximum sustained winds of 45 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 55 kph. It is forecast to move West Northwest at 22 kph.

Conduct press briefings as often as needed. This local effort will complement and reinforce efforts at the national level. Emphasis should be on proactive actions – evacuation rather than rescue.
