At 3:00 PM today, the center of Tropical Storm "URDUJA" (KAI-TAK) was estimated based on all available data at 55 km South Southeast of Romblon, Romblon (12.1°N, 122.4°E) with maximum winds of 55 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 80 km/h. It is forecast to move West Southwest at 15 km/h.
