**PRESENT WEATHER:**

AT 4:00 AM today, the eye of typhoon "INENG" was located based on all available data at 995 km east of Aparri, Cagayan (18.9°N, 130.7°E) with maximum sustained winds of 180 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 215 kph. It is forecast to move west at 25 kph.
