No. 2 for Region 12 (SOCCSKSARGEN)

FORECAST 12-HR RAINFALL	Light to occasionally moderate rains and thunderstorms
WATERCOURSES	 Rivers and Tributaries in: NORTH COTABATO particularly Libungan, Malasila, Toliman-
LIKELY TO BE	Dunakling, Maridagao, Kabacan, Mulita, Aklan, Kulaman, Upper
AFFECTED	Mlang, and Pulanggi

FORECAST 12-HR RAINFALL	Light to moderate rains and isolated thunderstorms
WATERCOURSES LIKELY TO BE AFFECTED	 Rivers and Tributaries in: SURIGAO DEL NORTE particularly Surigao and Magallanes. AGUSAN DEL NORTE particularly Lake-Mainit-Tubay, Asiga, Agusan, Linugos and Cabadbaran. DINAGAT ISLANDS particularly Malinao Inlet and Gaas Lulet. SURIGAO DEL SUR particularly Cantillan, Toracan, Tandag, Tago, Hubo-Oteiza, Hinatuan and Bislig. AGUSAN DEL SUR particularly Ojot, Wawa, Libang, Maosam, Kasilan, Gibong, Adgaoan, Sinulao, Kayonan and Andanan.

PUBLIC WARNINGS:

People living near the mountain slopes and in the low lying areas of the above mentioned river systems and the Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (LDRRMCs) concerned are still advised to be on alert for possible/further flashfloods and landslides and to take necessary precautionary measures.

In order to better inform/warn communities, you are reminded to disseminate this through local/community leaders and through your local media, including community radio stations. Conduct press briefings as often as needed. This local effort will complement and reinforce efforts at the national level. Emphasis should be on proactive actions – evacuation rather than rescue.

Let's untiringly aim for zero casualties.
