Lucia, Lugan Malaybalay, Maapon, Bucal (Lalangan), Lakayat, Tignoan, Agos, Anibawan (Polilio Island) and Upper Kilbay-Catabangan. • LAGUNA particularly Pagsanjan, Pila-Santa Cruz, San Juan and San Cristobal. • BATANGAS particularly Lian, Banabang-Molino, Pansipit, Kapumpong, Rosario-Lobo and Upper Bolbok (Lawaya). • RIZAL particularly Upper Marikina and Kaliwa.

No. 03 for Region IV-B (MIMAROPA)

WATERCOURSES STILL LIKELY TO BE AFFECTED	<u>Rivers and Tributaries in:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • ORIENTAL MINDORO particularly Malaylay-Baco, Pulang Tubig, Mag-Asawang Tubig, Butas, Pula, Aagsalin, Bansud, Samagui, Bongabon, Baroc, Bulalacao and Balete. • PALAWAN particularly in Abongan, Lian, Barabakan, Rizal, Caramay, Langogan, Babuyan, Bacungan, Iwahig Penal, Inagauan, Aborlan, Malasgao, Apurauan, Baton-Baton, Aramayawan, Ihawig, Panitian, Pulot, Lamakan, Kinluga, Eraan, Tiga Plan, Malabangan, Ilog, Bansang, Conduaga, Culasian, Iwahig (Brookes), Okayan, Canipan and Busuanga, Coron. • OCCIDENTAL MINDORO particularly in Abra De Ilog, Cagaray, Labangan, Magbando, Lunintao, Anahawin, Monpong, Amnay, Pola, Pagbahan, Mamburao and Ibod. • MARINDUQUE particularly in Tawiran-Tagum (Marinduque) and Boac.

No. 07 for Region V (Bicol Region)

WATERCOURSES STILL LIKELY TO BE AFFECTED	<u>Rivers and Tributaries in:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • CAMARINES SUR particularly Lower Kilbay, Catabangan, Ragay, Tinalmud, Tambang and Lagonoy. • CAMARINES NORTE particularly Labo and Daet Basud. • CATANDUANES particularly Cabuyan, Bato and Pajo. • ALBAY particularly Guinale and Upper Donsol. • MASBATE particularly Lanang, Mapayawan, Mandaong, Asid, Malbag, Guiom, Nainday, Daraga, Nauco (Aguada) and Beleno. • SORSOGON particularly Lower Donsol, Ogod, Putiao, Cadacan, Banuang-Duan, Fabrica (Tugbugan) and Matnog.

No.12 for Region VI (Western Visayas)

FORECAST 12-HR RAINFALL	Light to occasionally moderate rains and isolated thunderstorms
WATERCOURSES STILL LIKELY TO BE AFFECTED	<u>Rivers and Tributaries in:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • CAPIZ particularly Panay, Mambusao, Panay Malinao, Alingon and Balantian. • NEGROS OCCIDENTAL particularly Malogo, Sicaba, Grande, Himocaan, Danao, Upper Tyabanan, Sipalay and Lower Ilog. • ILOILO particularly Pinantan, Barotac, Akalaygan, Jalaud, Jalano, Jagdong, Jalaur, Lamunan, Jaro-Agaman, Sibalom and Guimbal. • ANTIQUE particularly Sibalom, Ipayo, Cagaranan, Palawan, Cairauan, Dalanas and Tibiao. • AKLAN particularly Ibajay, Aklan and Jalo.

No. 06 for CAR (Cordillera Administrative Region)

FORECAST 12-HR RAINFALL	Moderate to occasionally heavy rains
WATERCOURSES STILL LIKELY TO BE AFFECTED	<u>Rivers and Tributaries in:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • BENGUET particularly Upper Bauang. • APAYAO particularly Upper Abulug. • ABRA particularly Upper Abra, Tineg and Ikmin. • IFUGAO rivers and its tributaries. • KALINGA rivers and its tributaries. • MOUNTAIN PROVINCE rivers and its tributaries.

PUBLIC WARNINGS:

People living near the mountain slopes and in the low lying areas of the above mentioned river systems are advised to take precautionary measures. Concerned Regional and Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (LDRRMCs) are advised to take necessary preparedness measures and possible response actions.

In order to better inform/warn communities, you are reminded to disseminate this through local/community leaders and through your local media, including community radio stations. Conduct press briefings as often as needed. This local effort will complement and reinforce efforts at the national level. Emphasis should be on proactive actions – evacuation rather than rescue.

Let's untiringly aim for zero casualties.
