FORECAST 12-HR RAINFALL	Isolated light rains or thunderstorms
WATERCOURSES NO LONGER TO BE AFFECTED	Rivers and Tributaries in: PALAWAN particularly Abongan, Lian, Barabakan, Rizal, Caramay, Langogan, Babuyan, Bacungan, Iwahig Penal, Inagauan, Aborlan, Malasgao, Apurauan, Baton-Baton, Aramayawan, Ihawig, Panitian, Pulot, Lamakan, Kinlugan, Eraan, Tiga Plan, Malabangan, Ilog, Bansang, Conduaga, Ivers.

With this development and unless significant rain occurs, this is the Final General Flood Advisory for this event in Region MIMAROPA.

MASBATE particularly Lanang, Mapayawan, Mandaong, Asid, Malbag, Guiom, Nainday, Daraga, Nauco (Aguada) and Beleno. ALBAY particularly Guinale and Upper Donsol. SORSOGON particularly Lower Donsol, Ogod, Putiao, Cadacan, Banuang-Duan, Fabrica (Tugbugan) and Matnog.

No. 06 for Region VIII (Eastern Visayas)

NORTHERN SAMAR – particularly Catarman, Bugko, Pambukhan, Catubig, Palapag, Mano, and Gamay LEYTE – particularly Sangputan, Palo, Salano (Quilot), Daguitan Marabang, Cadacan, Bongquirogon, Salug, Pagbanagaran, Pagsangahan, and Binahaan SOUTHERN LEYTE – particularly Bisay, Himbangan, and Pandan SAMAR – particularly Basey, Silaga, Calbiga, and Jibatan

No. 09 for Region 13 (CARAGA)

WATERCOURSES STILL LIKELY TO BE AFFECTED	 Rivers and Tributaries in: SURIGAO DEL NORTE particularly Surigao and Magallanes AGUSAN DEL SUR particularly Ojot, Wawa, Libang, Maosam, Kasilan, Gibong, Adgaoan, Sinulao, Kayonan and Andanan. DINAGAT ISLANDS particularly Malinao Inlet and Gaas Lulet. AGUSAN DEL NORTE particularly Lake-Mainit-Tubay, Asiga, Agusan, Linugos and Cabadbaran. SURIGAO DEL SUR particularly Cantillan, Toracan, Tandag, Tago, Hubo-Oteiza, Hinatuan and Bislig

No. 02 for CAR (CORDILLERA ADMINISTRATIVE REGION)

FORECAST 12-HR RAINFALL	Light to moderate rains and thunderstorms
WATERCOURSES STILL LIKELY TO BE AFFECTED	Rivers and Tributaries in: ABRA particularly Upper Abra, Tineg and Ikmin. APAYAO particularly Upper Abulug. BENGUET particularly Upper Bauang.

People living near the mountain slopes and in the low lying areas of the above mentioned river systems and the LDRRMCs concerned are advised to take the necessary precautionary measures.

In order to better inform/warn communities, you are reminded to disseminate this through local/community leaders and through your local media, including community radio stations. Conduct press briefings as often as needed. This local effort will complement and reinforce efforts at the national level. Emphasis should be on proactive actions – evacuation rather than rescue.

Let's untiringly aim for zero casualties.
