Generally, water levels of rivers within the basin are still below alert stage. However, monsoon rains are expected to prevail over the basin for the next few days. Thus, slow to gradual rise of water levels particularly the small tributaries and streams and the allied river systems within the basin is expected.

People living near the mountains slopes and in the low-lying areas, particularly areas with poor drainage systems, coastal or high tide affected areas, adjacent to or along the above-mentioned river systems and the Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils concerned are **advised to be alert for possible flashfloods, landslides, coastal flooding and/or river flooding.**
