At 4:00 AM today, the eye of Typhoon "Ineng" was located based on all available data at 123 KM northeast of Calayan, Cagayan with maximum sustained winds of 160 KPH near the center and gustiness of up to 195 KPH. It is forecast to move north northeast at 9 KPH.
