At 4:00 PM today, the eye of Typhoon “Ineng” was located based on all available data at 105 KM northeast of Basco, Batanes with maximum sustained winds of 150 KPH near the center and gustiness of up to 185 KPH. It is forecast to move north northeast at 13 KPH.
