PRESENT WEATHER:

At 3:00 pm today, the center of Tropical Storm “Huaning” (Haitang) was estimated based on all available data at 185 km Northwest of Basco, Batanes (21.6°N 120.7°E) with maximum sustained winds of 80km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 110 km/h. It is forecast to move North at 24 km/h. Southwest Monsoon affecting the Western section of Northern and Central Luzon.

People living near the mountains slopes and in the low lying areas of the above mentioned river systems and the Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils concerned are advised to take necessary precautionary measures.

Conduct press briefings as often as needed. This local effort will complement and reinforce efforts at the national level. Emphasis should be on proactive actions – evacuation rather than rescue.
