**PRESENT WEATHER:**

**AT 3:00 AM TODAY, TROPICAL DEPRESSION “BASYANG” WAS ESTIMATED BASED FROM ALL AVAILABLE DATA AT 175KM WEST SOUTHWEST OF DUMAGUETE CITY, NEGROS ORIENTAL (8.9N, 121.8E) WITH MAXIMUM SUSTAINED WINDS OF 45KM/H NEAR THE CENTER AND GUSTINESS OF UP TO 60KM/H. IT IS FORECAST TO MOVE WEST SOUTHWEST AT 26KM/HR. NORTHEAST MONSOON AFFECTING NORTHERN AND CENTRAL LUZON.**
