

**PRESENT WEATHER:**

At 3:00 PM today, the eye of TY “OMPONG” was located based on all available data at 625 KM East Northeast of Virac, Catanduanes (14.8°N, 129.9°E) maximum sustained winds of 205 KM/H near the center and gustiness of up to 255 KM/H. It is moving West Northwest at 25 KM/H. Southwest monsoon affecting Southern Luzon, Visayas and Mindanao.

### No. 01 for CAR (Cordillera Administrative Region)

<b>WATERCOURSES LIKELY TO BE AFFECTED</b>	<b><u>Rivers and Tributaries in:</u></b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• <b>APAYAO</b> – particularly UPPER ABULUG.</li><li>• <b>KALINGA</b></li><li>• <b>MOUNTAIN PROVINCE</b></li><li>• <b>BENGUET</b> – particularly UPPER BAUANG.</li><li>• <b>IFUGAO</b></li><li>• <b>ABRA</b> – particularly UPPER ABRA, TINEG AND IKMIN.</li></ul>
