I. SITUATION OVERVIEW

Tropical Depression "BISING" has slightly slowed down as it begins to move northwestward.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Estimated rainfall amount is from moderate to occasionally heavy rains within the 300 km of Tropical Depression (TD). Sea travel is risky over the Eastern Seaboards of Southern Luzon, of Visayas, and of Mindanao. 	
Location of Eye/Center	At 10:00 AM today, the center of Tropical Depression "BISING" was estimated based on all available data at 515 km East of Hinatuan, Surigao del Sur (8.6°N, 131.0°E).
Strength	Maximum winds of up to 45 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 55 kph.
Forecast Movement	Forecast to move Northwest at 11 kph.

II. ACTIONS TAKEN

- NDRRM Operations Center disseminated **Severe Weather Bulletin No. 03 for Tropical Depression "BISING"** to all OCD Regional Offices through SMS and facsimile and uploaded on the NDRRMC website for further dissemination to their respective local DRRMCs from the provincial down to the municipal levels.
 - Directed RDRRMCs concerned through the OCD Regional Offices to undertake precautionary measures in their areas of responsibility (AOR) and subsequently advised local DRRMCs to initiate pre-emptive evacuation of families in low-lying areas and mountainous areas if situations warrants.
