I. SITUATION OVERVIEW

Tropical Depression "BISING" has weakened and is expected to become a Low Pressure Area within the next 24 hours.

- Estimated rainfall amount is from moderate to occasionally heavy rains within the 300 km diameter.
- Sea travel is risky over the Northern Seaboard of Northern Luzon and the Eastern Seaboards of Southern Luzon and of Visayas.

Location of Eye/Center	At 10:00 AM today, the center of Tropical Depression "BISING" was estimated based on all available data at 595 km East of Catarman, Northern Samar (12.4 °N, 130.1 °E).
Strength	Maximum winds of up to 45 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 55 kph.
Forecast Movement	Forecast to move North Northeast at 10 kph.
Forecast Positions	• 24 Hour (Tomorrow morning): 700 km East Northeast of Catarman, Northern Samar(14.0°N, 130.9°E)
NO TROPICAL CYCLONE WARNING SIGNAL	

The public and the disaster risk reduction and management council concerned are advised to take appropriate actions and watch for the next weather bulletin to be issued at 11 PM today.

II. ACTIONS TAKEN

- NDRRM Operations Center disseminated **Severe Weather Bulletin No. 07 for Tropical Depression "BISING"** to all OCD Regional Offices through SMS and facsimile and uploaded on the NDRRMC website for further dissemination to their respective local DRRMCs from the provincial down to the municipal levels.

- Directed RDRRMCs concerned through the OCD Regional Offices to undertake precautionary measures in their areas of responsibility (AOR) and subsequently advised local DRRMCs to initiate pre-emptive evacuation of families in low-lying areas and mountainous areas if situations warrants.
