### I. SITUATION OVERVIEW

The Low Pressure Area (LPA) east of Mindanao has developed into a Tropical Depression and was named "CRISING".

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Estimated rainfall amount is from moderate to occasionally heavy within 250 km diameter of the Tropical Depression.</li><li>Tropical Cyclone Warning Signal 1 may be raised over Masbate, Sorsogon, Albay, and Biliran provinces in the next bulletin at 8 PM tonight.</li></ul>
<b>Location of Eye/Center</b>	At 4:00 PM today, the center of Tropical Depression (TD) "CRISING" was estimated based on all available data at <b>555 km East of Maasin City, Southern Leyte (10.4°N, 129.9°E)</b> .
<b>Strength</b>	Maximum winds of up to <b>45 kph</b> near the center and gustiness of up to <b>55 kph</b> .
<b>Forecast Movement</b>	Forecast to move <b>West Northwest</b> at <b>22 kph</b>
<b>Forecast Positions</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li><b>24 Hour (Tomorrow afternoon):</b> 45 km North of Borongan City, Eastern Samar (12.0°N, 125.5°E)</li><li><b>48 Hour (Sunday afternoon):</b> In the vicinity of Victoria, Oriental Mindoro (13.2°N, 121.3°E)</li><li><b>72 Hour (Monday afternoon):</b> 365 km West Northwest of Calapan City, Oriental Mindoro (14.2°N, 117.9°E)</li><li><b>96 Hour (Tuesday afternoon):</b> 290 km West Northwest of Iba, Zambales (16.0°N, 117.4°E)</li></ul>


