I. SITUATION OVERVIEW

"CRISING" HAS MAINTAINED ITS STRENGTH AND CONTINUES TO MOVE CLOSER TO SAMAR PROVINCES.

- Estimated rainfall amount is from moderate to occasionally heavy within the 250 km diameter of the Tropical Depression.
- Expected to make landfall over Samar island this afternoon.
- Residents in areas under Tropical Cylone Warning Signal (TCWS) 1 are alerted against possible flashfloods and landslides.
- Possible inclusion of Camarines Norte, Marinduque and Mindoro
 Provinces under TCWS 1 in the next bulletin

Location of Eye/Center	At 7:00 AM today, the center of Tropical Depression (TD) "CRISING" was estimated based on all available data at 185 km East of Guiuan, Eastern Samar (11.1°N, 127.4°E). Maximum winds of up to 55 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 68 kph. Forecast to move West Northwest at 20 kph

II. ACTIONS TAKEN

- NDRRM Operations Center disseminated Severe Weather Bulletin No. 6 for Tropical Depression "CRISING" to all OCD Regional Offices through SMS and facsimile and uploaded on the NDRRMC website for further dissemination to their respective local DRRMCs from the provincial down to the municipal levels.
- Directed RDRRMCs concerned through the OCD Regional Offices to undertake precautionary measures in their areas of responsibility (AOR) and subsequently advised local DRRMCs to initiate pre-emptive evacuation of families in low-lying areas and mountainous areas if situations warrants.
- Concerned Regional and Local DRRMCs are directed to undertake the necessary preparedness measures and possible response actions.
