### Severe Weather Bulletin No. 1 re Tropical Depression "CRISING"

#### I. SITUATION OVERVIEW

The Low Pressure Area (LPA) east of Mindanao has developed into a Tropical Depression and was named "CRISING".

- Estimated rainfall amount is from moderate to occasionally heavy within 250 km diameter of the Tropical Depression.
- Tropical Cyclone Warning Signal 1 may be raised over Masbate, Sorsogon, Albay, and Biliran provinces in the next bulletin at 8 PM tonight.

Location of Eye/Center	At 4:00 PM today, the center of Tropical Depression (TD) "CRISING" was estimated based on all available data at <b>555 km East of Maasin City, Southern Leyte (10.4°N, 129.9°E)</b> .
Strength	Maximum winds of up to <b>45 kph</b> near the center and gustiness of up to <b>55 kph</b> .
Forecast Movement	Forecast to move <b>West Northwest at 22 kph</b>

## II. ACTIONS TAKEN

- NDRRM Operations Center disseminated **Severe Weather Bulletin No. 1 for Tropical Depression “CRISING”** to all OCD Regional Offices through SMS and facsimile and uploaded on the NDRRMC website for further dissemination to their respective local DRRMCs from the provincial down to the municipal levels.
- Directed RDRRMCs concerned through the OCD Regional Offices to undertake precautionary measures in their areas of responsibility (AOR) and subsequently advised local DRRMCs to initiate pre-emptive evacuation of families in low-lying areas and mountainous areas if situations warrants.
