#### I. SITUATION OVERVIEW

**TROPICAL DEPRESSION CRISING HAS MAINTAINED ITS STRENGTH AS IT MOVES IN A WEST-NORTHWEST DIRECTION**

- Estimated rainfall amount is from moderate to occasionally heavy within 250 km diameter of the Tropical Depression.
- **Expected to make landfall over Samar island tomorrow afternoon.**
- **Residents in areas under Tropical Cyclone Warning Signal (TCWS) 1 are alerted against possible flashfloods and landslides.**
- **Possible inclusion of Camarines Sur, Catanduanes and Burias island under TCWS 1 in the next bulletin to be issued at 11 PM today.**

Location of Eye/Center	At <b>7:00 PM</b> today, the center of Tropical Depression (TD) "CRISING" was estimated based on all available data at <b>340 km East of Guiuan, Eastern Samar (10.6°N, 128.8°E)</b> .
Strength	Maximum winds of up to <b>45 kph</b> near the center and gustiness of up to <b>55 kph</b> .
Forecast Movement	Forecast to move <b>West Northwest</b> at <b>22 kph</b>

## II. ACTIONS TAKEN

- NDRRM Operations Center disseminated **Severe Weather Bulletin No. 2 for Tropical Depression "CRISING"** to all OCD Regional Offices through SMS and facsimile and uploaded on the NDRRMC website for further dissemination to their respective local DRRMCs from the provincial down to the municipal levels.
- Directed RDRRMCs concerned through the OCD Regional Offices to undertake precautionary measures in their areas of responsibility (AOR) and subsequently advised local DRRMCs to initiate pre-emptive evacuation of families in low-lying areas and mountainous areas if situations warrants.
