I. SITUATION OVERVIEW

13 April 2017

The monitored Low Pressure Area (LPA) was estimated based on all available data at 900 km East of Hinatuan, Surigao del Sur (8.0°N, 134.5°E).

14 April 2017

The LPA was estimated based on all available data at 615 km East of Surigao City, Surigao del Sur (9.8°N, 131.0°E) at 10:00 AM.

At 4:00 AM, the LPA developed into a Tropical Depression (TD) and was named "CRISING".

Tropical Cyclone Warning Signal (TCWS) No. 1 is raised in Sorsogon, Albay, and Masbate including Ticao Island in Luzon and Northern Samar, Eastern Samar, Samar, Biliran, and northern portion of Leyte in Visayas.

15 April 2017

At 4:00 AM, the center of TD "CRISING" was estimated at 220 km East of Guiuan, Eastern Samar (10.9°N, 127.7°E) with maximum winds of up to 55 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 68 kph. It is forecast to move West Northwest at 22 kph.

At 5:00 PM, TCWS No. 1 is raised in Sorsogon, Burias Island, Romblon, Masbate, Ticao Island, Aklan, Antique, Iloilo, Capiz, Cebu, Negros Occidental, Northern Samar, Samar, Eastern Samar, Biliran, Leyte, And Southern Leyte.

At 6:30 PM, TD "CRISING" has made landfall over Hernani, Eastern Samar.

After making landfall, "CRISING" has weakened into a Low Pressure Area. All TCWS are now lifted. Light to moderate rains is still expected over Visayas and Regions V and CARAGA.

II. EFFECTS

A. STATUS OF PORTS

A total of <u>4,851 passengers</u>, <u>384 rolling cargoes</u>, <u>34 vessels</u>, and <u>14 motor bancas</u> are stranded in ports in Central Visayas, Bicol, Easter Visayas, and Western Visayas, as of 4:00 PM, 15 April 2017:

III. DISASTER PREPAREDNESS

A. National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council

1. NDRRM Operations Center (NDRRMOC)

- a. The NDRRM Operations Center maintained its Blue Alert Status with representatives from AFP, PNP, BFP, and PCG rendering duty for prompt coordination and monitoring for the possible effects of the Low Pressure Area.
- b. Disseminated Severe Weather Bulletin, Weather Advisories, 24-hour Public Weather Forecasts, and General Flood Advisories to all RDRRMCs/OCDROs through SMS, facsimile, and websites for further dissemination to their respective Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (LDRRMCs) from the provincial down to the municipal level.
- c. Conducted Pre-Disaster Risk Assessment (PDRA) Meeting on 14 April 2017, 2:00 PM at the NDRRM Operations Center, Camp General Emilio Aguinaldo, Quezon City.

2. Department of Science and Technology (DOST)

Philippine Atmospheric, Geophysical and Astronomical Services Administration (PAGASA)

a. Continuously provides weather updates and severe weather bulletins

3. Department of Interior and Local Government (DILG)

- a. Provided information/advisories to all concerned DILG Regional Offices (ROs) regarding the development of the LPA thru emails and text blasts.
- b. Instructed all concerned DILG ROs to take proactive measures in the impending disaster.
- c. Provided constant updates on weather alerts/advisories to all ROs.
- d. Issued an Advisory to all concerned Regions on the LPA on 14 April 2017.
- e. Coordinates with PAGASA and MGB in monitoring updates
- f. Advised and directed all concerned LGUs on the following:
 - To monitor all PAGASA weather advisories and typhoon bulletins as well as the Project NOAH via website;
 - To establish critical preparedness actions based on the Operations Listo protocols, and prioritize prepositioning of supplies and equipment for response;
 - iii. To visit the MGB Geo-Hazard Web Portal at gdis.denr.gov.ph/mgbgoogle for additional information;
 - iv. To observe existing protocols, including Proof of Service;
 - v. To activate their disaster monitoring and reporting systems;
 - vi. To implement evacuation protocol in areas with high susceptibility of landslide and flooding, if necessary;
 - vii. To restrict or ban tourist activities such as, but not limited to, mountaineering/hiking, surfing, diving, spelunking, within their area of jurisdiction;
- viii. To warn small scale miners to stay in safer ground and avoid mining activities.

4. Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD)

a. Prepositioned a total of ₱1,054,408,549.12 standby funds, 418,290 family food packs (FFPs), and ₱755,231,459.63 worth of food and non-food items available at the Field Offices in Regions CAR, NCR, I, II, III, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, VI, NIR, VII, VIII, IX, X, XI, XII, CARAGA, and National Resource Operations Center (NROC) as of 14 April 2017:

b. Maintains 30,000 FFPs for prepositioning to 18 DSWD Regional Warehouses.

c. Undertaken forward stockpiling at the Local Government Units (LGUs).

d. Two (2) Disaster Response Center Hubs with mechanized packing system which maintains 100,000 FFPs per Hub, namely: NROC inPasay City and Visayas Disaster Response Center in Cebu to augment to affected regions in Luzon and Visayas and Mindanao, respectively.

e. Disaster Response Operations Monitoring and Information Center (DROMIC) at the Central Office and Disaster Response Units (DRUs) in 18 regions are on standby for regional PDRA monitoring, data and information management.

f. Five hundred seven (597) National Level Quick Response Team (QRT)

members are ready for mobilization anytime.

g. A total of 1,544 staff in 18 regions comprise the QRTs including Social Welfare and Development Teams (SWADTs) and Provincial/Municipal Action Teams (P/MATs).

- h. The Department had undertaken three batches of training for personnel on Psychosocial Support Processing; four (4) batches of Family Evacuation Preparedness and Camp Coordination and Camp Management training for 262 personnel; two batches of Inventory and Warehouse Management involving 150 DSWD CO and regional staff; and two batches of Disaster Response Communications and Information Management involving 70 DSWD CO and FO (3 per region) staff with support coming from OCD's ICT and ERIC's teams.
- i. DSWD RETTs at central and regional levels are on standby and ready for mobilization and deployment;
- Organized and trained private volunteers on Evacuation/Camp Management, Relief Distribution, and family food packs repackers, are on standby and ready for mobilization and deployment;

k. Organized trained volunteers through the DSWD Bayanihang Bayan Registry of Volunteers on rapid assessment, relief distribution, camp management,

stress debriefing, and among others; and,

Parent leaders of Pantawid Pamilya and Community Driven Development (CDD) leaders, nationwide (except Batanes) are ready as force multipliers on humanitarian response operations.

- b. Issued alert memorandum to all regional offices to actively monitor the weather disturbance and their preparations such as Activation of Code Alert, Activation of Operations, Preposition of human resource and stockpilitng of medicines and medical supplies.

 RDRRMC-ARMM Operations Center maintained is Blue Alert Status for all DRRM stakeholders to heighten their preparedness measures for the possible effects of the LPA.

OCD ARMM

 Coordinated with RDRRMC-ARMM for preparedness measures and possible response operation due to the probable effects of LPA.

 Coordinated with R/P/MDRRMC for 24/7 monitoring and reporting of any incidents of landslide, flooding, flashflood and other related events thru SMS, facsimile, and email.

- c. Continuous early warning message and weather forecast re: LPA is being sent and disseminated through SMART InfoBoard, facsimile, email and social media.
- d. OCR-ARMM Operations Center has 24/7 duty officer to monitor and report any untoward incident.

a. Rescue groups are on standby to respond to any emergency situation.
