I. SITUATION OVERVIEW:

- Since 10 July 2017, the Province of Maguindanao has experienced light to moderate continuous rains due to local thunderstorms. This resulted to the swelling of tributaries of Mindanao River Basin particularly the Pulangi River, Mindanao River and Ligawasan.
- As of this date, a total of 37 barangays in Cotabato City were reported flooded due to overflowed Rio Grande de Mindanao River caused by continuous heavy rainfall.
- A total of 13 barangays in Bagumbayan, Sultan Kudarat were reported flooded due to overflowed Allah River caused by continuous heavy rainfall since 15 June 2017.

II. EFFECTS:

A. INCIDENTS MONITORED

1. On 18 July 2017, 6:00 PM, **minor landslide incidents** occurred in Barangays Nangi, Borongotan, Blensong, Nuro, Darugao, Rempes, and Kaba-kaba, all in the Municipality of Tupi, South Cotabato.
2. On 19 July 2017, 9:00 PM, **strong wind incident** occurred at Barangay Martires, Jolo, Sulu which uprooted a tree. Six (6) persons sustained minor injuries.
3. On 26 July 2017, a **strong wind incident** was reported in Barangay Larap, Sitangkai, Tawi-Tawi.

B. AFFECTED POPULATION (TAB A)

1. A total of **93,573 families or 459,435 persons** were affected in Cotabato City and in the provinces of Sultan Kudarat and Maguindanao. Of which, **510 families/ 2,550 persons** were evacuated in **three (3) evacuation centers** in Cotabato City.

1. **One (1) dead and six (6) injured persons** were reported in the Province of Maguindanao:

D. STATUS OF LIFELINES

ROADS AND BRIDGES

1. A total of **4 roads and 2 bridges** in Bagumbayan, Sultan Kudarat were reported not passable due to flooding:

G. COST OF DAMAGES

1. A total of **₱22,165,888.25** worth of damages in agriculture was incurred in Bagumbayan, Sultan Kudarat due to flooding.

III. ACTIONS TAKEN

A. COST OF ASSISTANCE (TAB B)

1. A total of **₱25,929,856.00** cost of assistance from DSWD and LGUs were provided to the affected families in the Province of Maguindanao and **Cotabato City**.

B. RDRRMCs

1. REGION XII

CDRRMC Cotabato City

- a. Alerted all BDRRMCs regarding the flooding and possible pre-emptive evacuation.
- b. Conducted meeting with City School Division of DepEd to discuss possible cancellation of classes of 10 schools in affected barangays.
- c. Cotabato City Health Office deployed health workers for medical mission on the affected families.
- d. Issued directive to impose force evacuation if the situation warrants.
- e. Ongoing assessment and validation of affected agricultural areas by Cotabato City Agriculture Office.
- f. LGU Cotabato City distributed family food packs to the evacuated families.
- g. Local SAR groups conducted evacuation to families residing along the riverbanks and low-lying areas.

MDRRMO Bagumbayan

- a. Alerted all BDRRMCs regarding the flooding and possible pre-emptive evacuation.
- b. Conducted meeting to request gas augmentation to Sultan Kudarat Provincial Government.
- c. Initiated the filling of sand bags along Allah River, ongoing validation and assessment of damages of Bagumbayan Municipal Agriculture Office.

Municipal Engineering Office

- a. Ongoing assessment of damages to affected roads and bridges.
- b. Prioritized the repair of damaged infrastructure.

Provincial Government of Sultan Kudarat

- a. Provided assistance on fuel for dredging and desilting to LGU Bagumbayan.
- b. Augmented ₱500,000.00 for sandbagging to LGU Bagumbayan.

2. REGION ARMM

OCD ARMM

- a. Continuous coordination with Local DRRM Officials.
- b. Augmented 400 liters of fuel assistance for the clearing operations.
- c. Coordinated with PAGASA Station Cotabato re weather updates.

MDRRMC Pagalungan (Maguindanao)

- a. Rescue Group composed of PNP, BFP, AFP and volunteers conducted search and retrieval operation.
- b. Provided financial assistance to the bereaved family of the drowning victim.

MDRRMCs Kabuntalan and Northern Kabuntalan (Maguindanao)

- a. Conducted clearing operations of water hyacinths to decongest the tributaries of the river.

MDRRMC Upi (Maguindanao)

- a. Provided relief assistance for the families staying in the gymnasium;

MDRRMC Datu Piang (Maguindanao)

- a. Conducted clearing operations of water hyacinths that accumulated below the Engr. Wahid Piang Bridge, connecting the Municipalities of Midsayap and Datu Piang.

MDRRMC Sitangkai (Tawi-Tawi)

- a. Provided hot plates for the families affected.
