Main Pampanga River coming from the province of Nueva Ecija down to its mouth in Manila Bay continues to remain way below alert level stage despite the rains brought about by the southwest monsoon mainly on the southwest part of the basin. The effects of southwest monsoon over the area is likely to continue until this weekend however, main Pampanga River will still remain below alert level stage.

#### **I. ACTIONS TAKEN**

- NDRRM Operations Center disseminated **General Flood Advisory for Pampanga River Basin and Allied Rivers** for tropical storm "Gorio" to OCDRC III through SMS and facsimile and uploaded on the NDRRMC website for further dissemination to their respective local DRRMCs from the provincial down to the municipal levels
- The Local DRRM Offices along the abovementioned areas of concern are advised to continue to take precautionary measures to mitigate potential adverse impacts of accumulation of rainwater coupled with the high tide at relatively low-lying areas and area with poor drainage system.
