I. SITUATION OVERVIEW

"KIKO" has slightly accelerated and is now moving in a Northwest direction towards extreme Northern Luzon.

- Estimated rainfall amount is from moderate to heavy within the 300 km diameter of the Tropical Depression.
- Expected to pass extreme Northern Luzon tonight and close to Batanes tomorrow morning and expected to exit Philippine Area of Responsibility by Thursday, 7 September 2017, early morning.
- Meanwhile, moderate to occasionally heavy rains is expected today over Northern Luzon. Residents in these areas are advised to be alert against possible flashfloods and landslides.
- Fisherfolks and those with small seacrafts are advised not to venture out over the eastern seaboard of Northern and Central Luzon due to approaching Tropical Depression.
- Sea travel is risky over the eastern seaboard of Northern and Central Luzon due to approaching Tropical Depression

Location of Eye/Center	At 10:00 AM today, the center of Tropical Depression "KIKO" was estimated based on all available data at 350 km East of Tuguegarao City, Cagayan (18.0°N, 125.0°E) .
Strength	Maximum winds of up to 55 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 65 kph .
Forecast Movement	Forecast to move Northwest at 17 kph

Some banana plants are tilted, a few downed and leaves are generally damaged. • Twigs of small trees may be broken. • Rice crops, however, may suffer significant damage when it is in its flowering stage.
