I. SITUATION OVERVIEW:

Tropical Depression "MARING" is now in the vicinity of Pampanga and is about to leave the landmass of Luzon.

Moderate to heavy rains will be experienced over Pampanga, Bulacan, Tarlac, Zambales, Bataan and Pangasinan. Meanwhile, light to moderate with occasionally heavy rains during thunderstorms is expected over Metro Manila, the rest of Central Luzon, CALABARZON and MIMAROPA. Residents in these areas are alerted against possible landside and flashfloods.

Sea travel remains risky over the **seaboards of Central Luzon, CALABARZON and Mindoro** due to TD "Maring".

TD "Maring" is expected to leave Luzon landmass tonight and exit PAR tomorrow evening or Thursday early morning.


Tropical Cyclone Warning Signal over **Camarines Norte** is now lifted.

Location of eye/center	At 4:00 PM today, the center of Tropical Depression "MARING" was estimated based on all available data including Subic Doppler radar in the vicinity of Bacolor, Pampanga (15.1°N, 120.6°E).
Strength	Maximum winds of up to 60 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 100 kph.
